Subject: **Invitation to Count the Nuclear Weapons Money and Bertha von Suttner consultation.** The Euston Flyer, Saturday June 29. 5:30-7:30pm

Join **Kristýna Chyňavová** from the PragueVision Institute for Sustainable Security and Move the Nuclear Weapons Money for an informal consultation over drinks and food (self-pay) at the Euston Flyer, 83-87 Euston Road, London on Saturday June 29 from 5:30-7:30pm.

Kristyna will report on and discuss:

- Count the Nuclear Weapons Money, an action taking place during UN Disarmament Week to demonstrate the colossal amount of money being spent on nuclear weapons, and what that money could instead support. Over 7 days and 7 nights we will count out \$1 trillion (the global nuclear weapons budget for the next 10 years), and symbolically reallocate this to climate protection, poverty alleviation, health, education and sustainable development.

- Bertha von Suttner, the Prague-born anti-war activist who became the first woman to receive the Nobel Peace Prize. The PragueVision Institute for Sustainable Security is commemorating the 130th anniversary of the publication of her novel ‘Lay Down Your Arms’, with an international conference in October 2019 on the ideas of Bertha and their relevance to peace in Europe and the world today.

Kristyna is in London for the "Save the Earth, Abolish War" conference being organised by The Movement for the Abolition of War and taking place on June 29. She is also available on June 28 or July 1 to meet with organisations interested in the two initiatives, but who are unable to join the meeting on June 29.
