PEACE HISTORY: AN INTERNATIONAL PERSPECTIVE

November 5th marks the 35th anniversary of Manchester City Council declaring Manchester a Nuclear Free Zone, the first city in the world to do so.

At this year's Peace History Conference we are taking a wider-world view, looking at three elements relating to World War I and the following century with an international dimension.

The Chinese Labour Corps were one of the non-European forces contributing to the war effort that are ignored in our Euro-centric history of the conflict. The different treatment of the Corps by the British and French shines a light on the differing racial attitudes in the two countries.

While the Women's International League for Peace and Freedom still works for peace around the world, its origins and development are not so well-known.

The arms trade continues to cause conflict and undermine economies and justice in all corners of the globe but the role of Manchester and the North in the arms trade being one of the causes of WWI needs to be better understood.

Join us for a stimulating day of presentations and discussion.

And enjoy the Friday evening prelude of *Eloquent Protest*, with Roy Bailey, Claire Mooney and other artists for peace.
